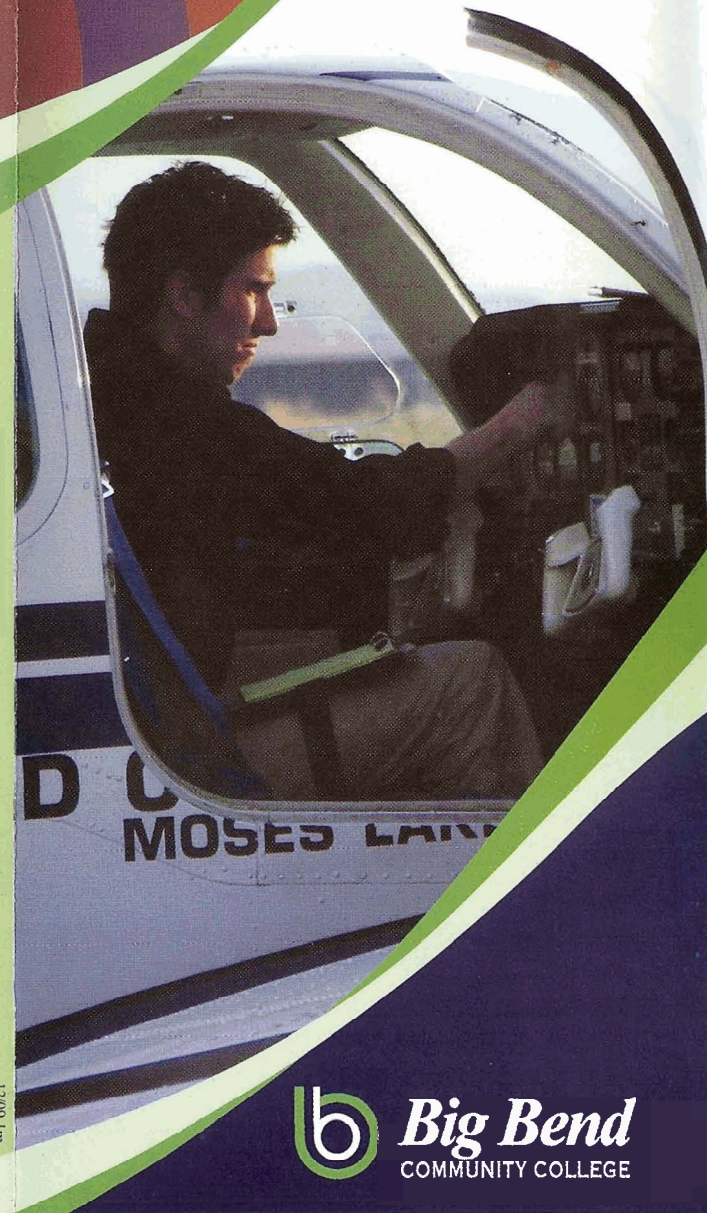

A career in aviation will provide excitement and challenges every day. It is a career involving the latest technologies, great people and fascinating places. While many different job skills are needed in the aviation industry, BBCC's Aviation (Commercial Pilot) Program prepares students to take a seat up front – where the action is. BBCC has a total of 25 aircraft in its training fleet. The Commercial Pilot Training program provides flight instruction along with ground school courses to prepare students for obtaining a commercial pilot certificate with instrument rating. To meet these requirements, most students require more than six quarters to complete the training. Because of this need, classes are scheduled each summer quarter. Additional ratings for flight instructor, instrument flight instructor, multi-engine, and seaplane may be earned after completing the commercial pilot certificate.
